

## Wave 6 Survey Toplines

### Fall 2019 -- Detroit Neighborhoods

N=1,835

The Detroit Metro Area Communities Study (DMACS) is a panel survey of Detroit residents launched in 2016. The original panel of respondents was drawn from an address-based probability sample of all occupied Detroit households. In subsequent years, the panel has been refreshed through additional address-based sampling.

In this mixed-mode study, interviews were self-administered online, and interviewer-administered in person and on the telephone between August 2, 2019 and December 17, 2019. We invited 1,178 existing DMACS panelists who had already responded to at least one prior survey to complete the Wave 6 survey.<sup>1</sup> We also invited 6,071 people from a randomly-selected address-based refreshment sample of Detroit households, including an oversample of households in Detroit's Strategic Neighborhood Fund neighborhoods. We invited a total of 7,249 people to complete this survey and obtained a response rate of 25% (using AAPOR Response Rate 1). The 1,855 Detroit residents who responded to the survey are comprised of the following:

- 276 people who were initially recruited for DMACS Wave 1 in 2016
- 64 people who were initially recruited for a DMACS survey of residents in the MorningSide neighborhood (Census Tract 5019) in 2017
- 382 people who were initially recruited for DMACS Wave 3 in 2018
- 1,113 from the refreshment sample of Detroit households

We report results for these 1,835 Detroit residents.

The below results reflect weighted responses. Survey weights were constructed using the following process. First, base weights were constructed for each Wave 6 respondent to compensate for the differential probability of selection in oversampled communities. For existing panelists, the base weights reflect the calibrated weights they were given in their recently completed DMACS survey. Second, we adjusted for non-response. Finally, we calibrated the weights to ensure that the resulting weighted data are representative of the population of the City of Detroit based on auxiliary data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2018 American Community Survey (ACS). We used a raking estimator to calibrate the weights so that they would match the ACS totals on gender, age, race, education and income. The margin of sampling error for a random sample survey of this size would be +/- 3.8 percentage points at the 95% confidence level; the actual margin of sampling error varies by statistic due in part to the complex sample design.

### Sample Demographics
