## Ypsilanti Wave 3 Toplines ● January 15 - March 18, 2024

The Michigan Metro Area Communities Study (MIMACS) is designed to provide a reliable source for timely and relevant public opinion data in select Michigan communities by using state-of-the-art scientific methods to obtain the most representative insights available. MIMACS is part of Michigan CEAL, a transdisciplinary partnership of researchers and community leaders, which engages with partners to solicit input on questionnaires and to help interpret results and disseminate them to the community. The original panel of Ypsilanti respondents was drawn in February 2022 from an address-based probability sample of all occupied Ypsilanti households. The sample had <a href="three strata">three strata</a>: likely African American households, likely Hispanic households, and all others. Respondents were assigned a design weight that was equal to the inverse of the selection probability (the number of households in the area as estimated by the Census, divided by the number of sampled households in each strata, multiplied by the number of residents in the selected household).

For this third survey wave, we sent survey invitations to 1,036 Ypsilanti residents who completed at least one of the first two surveys conducted in Ypsilanti and 350 invitations to a randomly selected address-based refreshment sample of Ypsilanti households using the same sampling methodology. Surveys were self-administered online or interviewer administered via telephone between January 15, 2024 and March 18, 2024. We report results for the 673 Ypsilanti residents who completed the survey. We obtained an overall response rate of 51.3% (using AAPOR Response Rate 1); 60.2% for existing panelists and 24.9% for new panelists.

The below results reflect weighted responses. We applied raking to adjust the weights to match the estimated distributions on gender, age, race, education, and income based on the U.S. Census Bureau's 2021 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates. The margin of sampling error for a random sample survey of this size is 5.5% percentage points at the 95% confidence level; the actual margin of sampling error varies by statistic.
