

# **NOTABLE RESULTS: MIMACS - Grand Rapids Wave 1**

January 15 - March 18, 2024 1,379 Respondents

### Residency

- Just under half (49%) of Grand Rapids adults have lived in Grand Rapids for more than 20 years [city\_res\_len\_gr1], though only 16% have been in the same residence for more than 20 years [current res len gr1].
- 40% of Grand Rapids households rent their current residence [housing gr1].

#### **Healthcare**

• Most Grand Rapids residents are covered by insurance (91%) [insurance\_type\_gr1] and have a place where they regularly go for medical care (83%) [med\_care\_place\_gr1]. However, sizable numbers say they have experienced problems getting an appointment soon enough (29%) [healthcare\_prob\_scheappt\_gr1], don't trust the healthcare system (22%) [healthcare\_prob\_trust\_gr1], and have concerns about their out-of-pocket costs (37%) [healthcare\_prob\_cost\_gr1]. And more than a third (37%) say they had to wait to get medical care during the past 12 months because of the costs [med\_care\_delay\_cost\_gr1].

#### COVID-19

- More than 6 in 10 (63%) of Grand Rapids residents report that they had COVID-19 at least once, with another 8% reporting they are not sure [c3\_covid\_had\_gr1].
- Of those that have had COVID at least once, 26% say they experienced COVID symptoms for longer than a month [c3\_covlong\_gr1].
  - The most commonly reported long COVID symptoms are:
    - Tiredness or fatigue (73%) [c3\_covlong\_tired\_gr1]
    - Difficulty concentrating, forgetfulness, or memory problems (56%) [c3\_covlong\_fog\_gr1]
    - Changes to taste/smell (52%) [c3\_covlong\_smell\_gr1]
    - Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath (51%) [c3\_covlong\_breath\_gr1]
    - Joint or muscle pain (43%) [c3\_covlong\_joint\_gr1]

### **Mental Health**

- Large percentages of Grand Rapids residents report feeling nervous/anxious/on edge (54%) [mh\_anxiety\_gr1], being unable to stop worrying (38%) [mh\_worry\_gr1], or feeling depressed (38%) [mh\_depress\_gr1] for at least one day in the past week.
- Many Grand Rapids residents also report lacking companionship (50%)
   [mh\_companionship\_gr1], feeling left out (49%)[mh\_leftout\_gr1], or feeling isolated from others (48%) [mh\_isolated\_gr1] at least some of the time.

## **Neighborhood Satisfaction**

- When asked about their satisfaction with various aspects of their neighborhoods, Grand Rapids residents are most satisfied with their access to nearby stores (71%)
   [nb\_satis\_stores\_gr1], public facilities (69%) [nb\_satis\_facilities\_gr1], parks and playgrounds (66%) [nb\_satis\_parks\_gr1], and the condition of most houses (57%) [nb\_satis\_housequal\_gr1].
   They are least satisfied with the availability of affordable housing (26%) [nb\_satis\_houseprice\_gr1] and crime (38%) [nb\_satis\_crime\_gr1].
- Over three quarters (76%) report being at least somewhat satisfied overall with their neighborhood as a place to live [nb\_satis\_gr1].

# Transportation

- Roughly a quarter (22%) of Grand Rapids residents experience some level of transportation insecurity—a measure that captures if residents are unable to move from place to place in a safe or timely manner due to an absence of resources necessary for transportation.
  - o 13% experience low transportation insecurity.
  - 8% report high transportation insecurity.
  - o 78% of Grand Rapids residents are transportation secure.
- Grand Rapids residents are highly dependent on cars to get around. 86% drive their own personal vehicle at least a few times per week [transport\_mode\_owncar\_gr1]. Only 5% take the bus regularly [transport\_mode\_bus\_gr1] or use paratransit (2%) [transport\_mode\_para\_gr1] or a taxi service or rideshare (4%) [transport\_mode\_taxi\_gr1].
- 10% of adults in Grand Rapids don't have a valid driver's license [license gr1].
- 2% don't have insurance for the vehicle they use most of the time [vehicle usual insur gr1].

## **Financial Precarity**

- 22% of Grand Rapids households report having unmanageable levels of debt [fin debtexp gr1].
- 26% could not pay a \$400 emergency expense, while another 7% say they don't know if they could [expense 400 gr1].
- 34% had to cut the size of meals or skip meals because there wasn't enough money for food [cut\_meal\_cost\_gr1].
- 21% made at least one late rent or mortgage payment in the last year [freq\_late\_housing\_gr1]

### **Immigration**

- Grand Rapids residents are more likely to think it should be easier (44%) for foreigners to immigrate to the US, versus 23% that think it should be harder. 15% are unsure [immig\_ease\_gr1].
- More than twice as many Grand Rapids residents feel immigrants are more of a benefit (46%) rather than a cost (21%) to American society [immig\_benefit\_gr1].

### **Trust in Government**

• Grand Rapids residents on the whole are trusting of their governments to make decisions that are good for them. Small numbers never trust the federal (16%) [fedgov\_decision\_gr1], local (9%) [localgov\_decision\_gr1] or state (11%) government[stategov\_decision\_gr1].
