

NOTABLE RESULTS: MIMACS - Ypsilanti Wave 3

January 15 - March 18, 2024 673 Respondents (from Ypsilanti and Ypsilanti Township)

Residency

- Just over a third (34%) of Ypsilanti adults have lived in Ypsilanti for more than 20 years [fl_res_len], while only 16% have been in the same residence for more than 20 years [current_res_len_y3].
- 38% of Ypsilanti households rent their current residence [housing_y3].

Healthcare

• Most Ypsilanti residents are covered by insurance (94%) [insurance_type_y3] and have a place where they regularly go for medical care (87%) [med_care_place_y3]. However, sizable numbers say they have experienced problems getting an appointment soon enough (30%) [healthcare_prob_scheappt_y3], don't trust the healthcare system (22%) [healthcare_prob_trust_y3], and have concerns about their out-of-pocket costs (31%) [healthcare_prob_cost_y3]. And a third (33%) say they had to wait to get medical care during the past 12 months because of the costs [med_care_delay_cost_y3].

COVID-19

- Two thirds (66%) of Ypsilanti residents report that they had COVID-19 at least once, with another 8% reporting they are not sure [c3_covid_had_y3].
- Of those that have had COVID at least once, 20% say they experienced COVID symptoms for longer than a month [c3_covlong_y3].
 - The most commonly reported long COVID symptoms are:
 - Tiredness or fatigue (79%) [c3 covlong tired y3]
 - Difficulty concentrating, forgetfulness, or memory problems (58%) [c3_covlong_fog_y3]
 - Joint or muscle pain (57%) [c3_covlong_joint_y3]
 - Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath (51%) [c3 covlong breath y3]
 - Changes to taste/smell (46%) [c3_covlong_smell_y3]

Mental Health

- Large percentages of Ypsilanti residents report feeling nervous/anxious/on edge (58%) [mh_anxiety_y3], being unable to stop worrying (41%) [mh_worry_y3], or feeling depressed (41%) [mh_depress_y3] for at least one day in the past week.
- Many Ypsilanti residents also report lacking companionship (54%) [mh_companionship_y3], feeling left out (52%) [mh_leftout_y3], or feeling isolated from others (51%) [mh_isolated_y3] at least some of the time.

Neighborhood Satisfaction

- When asked about their satisfaction with various aspects of their neighborhoods, Ypsilanti residents are most satisfied with their access to nearby stores (66%) [nb_satis_stores_y3], public facilities (68%) [nb_satis_facilities_y3], parks and playgrounds (68%) [nb_satis_parks_y3], and the condition of most houses (62%) [nb_satis_housequal_y3]. They are least satisfied with the availability of affordable housing (33%) [nb_satis_houseprice_y3] and crime (39%) [nb_satis_crime_y3].
- Eight in ten (81%) report being at least somewhat satisfied overall with their neighborhood as a place to live [nb_satis_y3].

Transportation

- Roughly a quarter (24%) of Ypsilanti residents experience some level of transportation insecurity—a measure that captures if residents are unable to move from place to place in a safe or timely manner due to an absence of resources necessary for transportation.
 - o 16% experience low transportation insecurity.
 - o 7% report high transportation insecurity.
 - o 77% of Ypsilanti residents are transportation secure.
- Ypsilanti residents are highly dependent on cars to get around. 84% drive their own personal vehicle at least a few times per week [transport_mode_owncar_y3]. Only 6% take the bus regularly [transport_mode_bus_y3] or use paratransit (2%) [transport_mode_para_y3] or a taxi service or rideshare (2%) [transport_mode_taxi_y3].
- 8% of adults in Ypsilanti don't have a valid driver's license [license y3].
- 4% don't have insurance for the vehicle they use most of the time [vehicle usual insur y3].

Financial Precarity

- 27% of Ypsilanti households report having unmanageable levels of debt [fin debtexp y3].
- 26% could not pay a \$400 emergency expense, while another 7% say they don't know if they could [expense 400 y3].
- 36% had to cut the size of meals or skip meals because there wasn't enough money for food [cut_meal_cost_y3] .
- 17% made at least one late rent or mortgage payment in the last year [freq_late_housing_y3].

Immigration

- Ypsilanti residents are more likely to think it should be easier (45%) for foreigners to immigrate to the US, versus 29% that think it should be harder. 13% are unsure. [immig_ease_y3]
- More than twice as many Ypsilanti residents feel immigrants are more of a benefit (46%) rather than a cost (20%) to American society [immig_benefit_y3].

Trust in Government

• Ypsilanti residents on the whole are trusting of their governments to make decisions that are good for them. Small numbers never trust the federal (21%) [fedgov_decision_y3], local (12%) [localgov_decision_y3] or state (11%) government [stategov_decision_y3].
